A few days later, we made a stop in Yellowstone, and during a half-mile walk to

At the start of summer, we spent several days in North Carolina with counselors from Barnabas International, participating in a very helpful debrief on the last year of transition. It was emotionally tiring, but really valuable for us and for the kids.

After this, Dan spent a week in Tennessee with the rest of BEE World's field staff, working out the process for bringing on more pastor trainers. This was a lot of work over several long days, but the team walked away with a lot of good work done and a better path for incoming workers.

Then we drove from Lancaster, PA out to Dillon, MT to update and thank the body at <u>Grace Bible Church</u>. We camped through a few 45 degree nights on the way, but the time with the church was a true delight and genuine encouragement.

On the way there and back, we got to dodge wild drivers, explain "the plague" to our curious children, and share a room with an air conditioner in Mitchell, South Dakota that wheezes just like I do after a run. But we were also able to stop and spend sweet time with family and ministry partners in Montana, Minnesota, Indiana, and Ohio.

So, pleasant-hectic-pleasant was the rhythm for the summer, and God was good to us throughout. We know many of you prayed for us throughout the trip-thank you!


